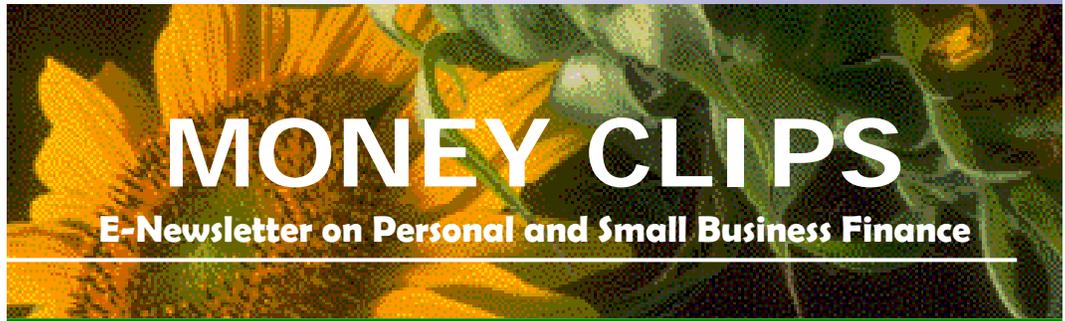

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Message From the Treasurer

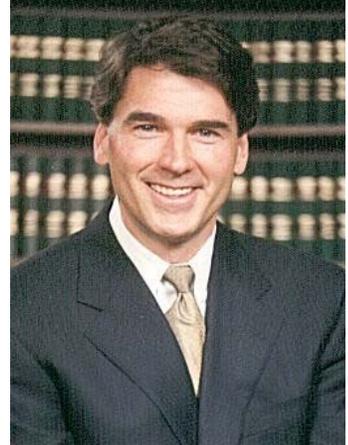

 \$ As we reported in the last Money Clips newsletter, the North Carolina Saves initiative is being implemented to support wealth creation for low and moderate-income individuals. It is designed to address the savings crisis many North Carolinians face today. Just a few years ago, the median net financial assets of households were only \$1,000. Forty percent of households with the least assets in our state had negative financial assets, causing their consumer debts to exceed their gross assets. Through information, advice and encouragement, the NC Saves coalition will work together in aiding those who wish to pay down debt, build an emergency fund, save for a home, save for an education or save for retirement. Savers will have access to no fee savings accounts through RBC Centura and other financial institutions. These accounts will act

as a catalyst to NC Saves participants to take the first step to building assets and saving for the future.

On June 22, 2004, the North Carolina Saves Coalition held the kick off luncheon to announce this new wealth building initiative. As chair of the Coalition, State Treasurer Richard Moore welcomed the audience of businesses and community groups and encouraged all of them to sign on as coalition members by signing up as the first NC Saver in the state. A representative from Cleveland Saves, the most successful Savers program in the country, explained what the program is all about and how a statewide effort gets started. At the end of the luncheon, attendees were asked to turn in commitment forms to become members of the NC Saves Coalition. Close to 40 organizations signed on that day!

Coalition planning meetings are being scheduled now to prepare for a statewide launch of the NC Saves program in 2005. Wachovia and University Park Baptist Church Have Partnered To Provide Financial Literacy Education**Community members' immediate financial needs met with aid, while money management training promotes long-term financial stability.**

Wachovia established a Money Smart partnership with University Park Baptist Church in Charlotte in January 2003. University Park started offering classes in May 2003. The church requires that community members seeking assistance from its Home Missions ministry, which disburses emergency aid, attend Money Smart financial literacy classes offered in partnership with Wachovia. With between 50 and 100 applications for aid received each month, Money Smart participant numbers are expected to increase dramatically in 2004. In addition to Emergency Financial assistance referrals, Money Smart participants find the classes through announcements in the church bulletin. Staff members at Crisis Assistance Ministry also refer clients to the classes. Course instructors are church members and volunteers who come from different

insurance. Instructors' job experience in relevant fields allows them to bring a wealth of practical knowledge into the classroom to supplement the course materials.

University Park benefits from Wachovia's innovative use of technology to enhance the program. Wachovia donated some of the equipment needed to allow the church to participate in interactive monthly satellite broadcasts, created and delivered by Wachovia's in-house television studio. Wachovia supplied the church with train-the-trainer materials to help the organization teach adult learning strategies, ensure consistency of delivery, and offer guidance on marketing the program. The church also has access to 10 one-hour Money Smart videos, interactive presentations that can provide additional value to the learning experience through use as teaching aids and reinforcement for participants. University Park currently offers two classes each month (third Saturday at noon and second Tuesday at p.m.). To seek more information regarding this program, contact the church via phone,

ABOUT MONEY SMART

The FDIC's Money Smart financial literacy program was developed in 2001. The Money Smart curriculum helps adults enhance their money management skills, understand basic financial services and build financial confidence, equipping them to use banking services effectively. The program consists of ten lessons – in both English & Spanish – covering topics such as using bank services, obtaining credit and buying a home.

Wachovia was the first major bank to partner with the FDIC to deliver this training. Previously, the FDIC worked primarily with community and trade associations and government entities, such as the National Bankers Association, the Association of Military Banks,

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HUD and the SBA. Wachovia uses a multi-pronged approach to delivering the training: Working with existing community partners non-profit and faith-based organizations to deliver the training. Working with for-profit and non-profit affordable housing developers to deliver training either directly or through a community partner. Leveraging the Wachovia retail network by conducting classes in selected financial center locations and Wachovia at Work sites. Giving employees the opportunity to volunteer to teach classes. Wachovia currently partners with 36 community groups in 27 cities to deliver Money

Smart and eCommunitiesfirst.

Take Time to Share Intellectual and Economic Resources

During a recent convention I witnessed a historic signing of a memorandum of understanding between two organizations that advocates for entrepreneur and staff member stakeholders.

At NABA's recent convention held July 6 - 11, 2004 in Orlando, Florida, leadership from both NABA's Division of Firms and the Association for the Advancement of Black Accountants in Southern Africa (ABASA) signed a memorandum. The purpose was to document mutual objectives of both groups in expanding relationships that are intended to maximize exchange of business and professional intellectual resources between black-owned accounting firms in South Africa and the United States of America.

Numerous delegates from South Africa attended this event including Jeff van Rooyen, Founding Member of ABASA & Executive Officer of the Financial Services Board (similar to the U.S. Securities Exchange Commission). Both groups plan to leverage intellectual capital including staffing exchanges, continuing professional education, business development and economic and cultural empowerment. During my interview with Mr. van Rooyen he emphasized that everyone benefits when all companies are financially stable to compete. He believes that with a competitive playing field the financial markets benefit the investing public.

What are we doing in North Carolina to leverage our intellectual capital and economic resources?

Start with the websites to the right to locate training resources and contacts to increase

your intellectual and economic resources. We have great college systems in our area many of which include business centers. If you're in the position to share your resources consider volunteering and/or supporting one of these groups.

The President of ABASA, Futhi Mtoba, states as one of their country's saying "if it has to be, it is up to us." I think this theme gives all of us a charge to take the time to share our intellectual capital, spend more time utilizing the educational resources in our area and leverage opportunities to increase our collective wealth.
